This Memorandum of Agreement (MOA), entered into by the Mechoopda Indian Tribe of Chico Rancheria (MIT) and the Northeast Information Center (NEIC), is regarding cultural and historical resource records, use and check procedures by and between the MIT and the NEIC of the California Historical Resource Information System (CHRIS).

The purpose of this MOA is to provide the means by which MIT, whose ancestral territory is located wholly within the boundaries of Butte County, can exchange cultural resource information and streamline access to the records and other confidential information on file at the NEIC.

The parties to this MOA hereby understand and agree to the following:




