**SUBJECT:** Grants Program Update

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**Summary**

As required by the regulations governing the Off-Highway Motor Vehicle Recreation (OHMVR) Division's Grants and Cooperative Agreements Program (Grants Program), the 2019/20 grants cycle began with the opening of the application process on January 13, 2020.

**Discussion**

OHMVR Division staff conducted one workshop in Pomona on January 6 and 7, 2020, and a second workshop in Redding on January 13 and 14, 2020.

Critical dates for the grant cycle process are as follows:

- Workshops were held on January 6 and 7, 2020 in Pomona and January 13 and 14, 2020 in Redding.
- Application process opened January 13, 2020.
- Preliminary applications are due March 2, 2020.
- Public review process is from March 2, 2020 through May 4, 2020.
- Final applications are due on June 1, 2020.
- OHMVR Division staff will review and validate scores for final applications during the months of June and July 2020.
- Intent to Award will be posted on the OHMVR Division website on August 3, 2020.
- If there are no appeals, the awards become final on September 3, 2020.

The San Bernardino Area Grant Funding History attachment provides a quick overview of the various grantees within the San Bernardino National Forest area. For the past ten grant cycles, the total funding awarded to the San Bernardino area for all grant application categories is close to \$20M. The Restoration category received the majority of the funding.
