SUBJECT: California Legislation

Summary

This report provides summary excerpts and the status of legislation affecting the Off-Highway Motor Vehicle Recreation Division. Information contained in this report is accurate as of August 5, 2021.

Senate Bill 227 (Jones): Off-highway vehicles.

Summary: This bill would establish a vehicle identification program for competition off-highway vehicles that do not meet the emissions standards established by the California Air Resources Board, as defined.

Status: Referred to Assembly Appropriations Committee.

Assembly Bill 232 (Gallagher) Off-highway vehicles: reciprocity.

Summary: This bill would limit California's recognition of other state's off-highway vehicle registration to those states that reciprocally recognize California's off-highway vehicle registration, as specified.

Status: Passed Senate Transportation Committee.

Assembly Bill 1512 (Bauer-Kahan) Off-highway vehicular recreation: Carnegie State Vehicular Recreation Area: Alameda-Tesla Expansion Area.

Summary: This bill would require the Department to preserve, in perpetuity, the 3,100 acre "Alameda-Tesla Expansion Area", to be managed as natural and cultural preserves. The bill would also require the Department to "work with other entities to have \$9M appropriated, donated, or transferred to the OHV Trust Fund" to manage the Expansion Area as preserves for nonmotorized recreation, by January 1, 2025. The bill would also restrict the use of the \$9 million for conservation of the Alameda-Tesla Expansion Area.

Status: Referred to Senate Appropriations Committee.
