# **Summary**

Governor Gavin Newsom released his January Proposed Budget on January 8, 2021 for the 2021/2022 fiscal year (FY).

#### **Discussion**

## **Operation Support**

The proposed budget includes \$73.208M for State Vehicular Recreation Areas (SVRA), division headquarters, statewide projects and programs, and administrative costs. This represents an increase of \$1.858M or 2.6% over last year, based on the estimated expenses detailed in the FY 21/22 Governor's Budget.

#### Local Assistance

The Grants and Cooperative Agreements program proposed authorization is \$30M Local assistance funding, and includes a \$1,000,000 transfer from the State Parks and Recreation Fund. The transfer is made possible per Budget Act item 3790-014-0392, and is funded through increased fuel tax revenues.

The Grants and Cooperative Agreements program also administers a federal assistance program of the United States Department of Transportation's Federal Highway Administration. The Recreational Trails Program provides support for motorized recreation. The Governor's Budget includes spending authority of \$9,000,000 from the Recreational Trails Fund which in the same level of spending authority as FY 20/21.

### Capital Outlay

Proposed Capital Outlay Projects of \$5.188M are as follows:

#### Oceano Dunes SVRA

 Grand Avenue Lifeguard Tower Headquarters \$1.026M for construction and equipment

#### Ocotillo Wells SVRA

• Auto Shop \$1.495M for construction

# **Prairie City SVRA**

• Initial erosion control for \$2.667M
