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Off-Highway Motor Vehicle Recreation Division Monitoring Site Selection Plan Rule 1001 Coastal Dunes Dust Control Requirements

On Tuesday, February 28, 2012, the Off-Highway Motor Vehicle Recreation (OHMVR) Division provided the draft Monitoring Site Selection Plan (MSSP), the first of several requirements in Rule 1001, to the San Luis Obispo County Air Pollution Control District for approval by the Air Pollution Control Officer.

Rule 1001, defines the MSSP as follows:

"A document providing a detailed description of the scientific approach, technical methods, criteria and timeline proposed to identify, evaluate and select appropriate locations for siting the temporary and long-term CDVAA [Coastal Dune Vehicle Activity Area] and control site monitors" (pg. 1001-2).
