Active Transportation Program


\$130M/year (increasing by \$100M+)

ATP Funding- Trails

Total Funding: \$314 million for 136 projects




Cycle 1

\$97 million 44 projects Cycle 2

\$133 million 59 projects Cycle 3

\$84 million 33 projects



Active Transportation Program

Key elements for being competitive:

- Transportation purpose: Strong data demonstrating increase in b/w
- Safety: will reduce injuries, fatalities
- Benefit disadvantaged community
- Next call for projects: Spring 2018 (programming for FY22 & 23)

Recreational Trails Program


- Administered by State Parks
