Cascade Ranch, 1862. Steele house, Steele / Humphrey house (2 staff residences), cottage, horse barn, cemetery and Cascade Falls.

Franklin Point shipwrecks, 1865 and 1867.

Prehistoric archaeological sites. Fragile sites exist throughout Año Nuevo State Park.

Lumber wharf, 1864 (site).

Año Nuevo Light Station, 1872 -1948.

Dickerman dairy ranch, 1880. Dairy barn, house, horse barn, creamery, and milk room. Structures are currently used for interpretation and staff residence.

Ocean Shore Railway Company. Work camp site, 1904-1906.

Portola Expedition, 1769. Several ill soldiers recover.
