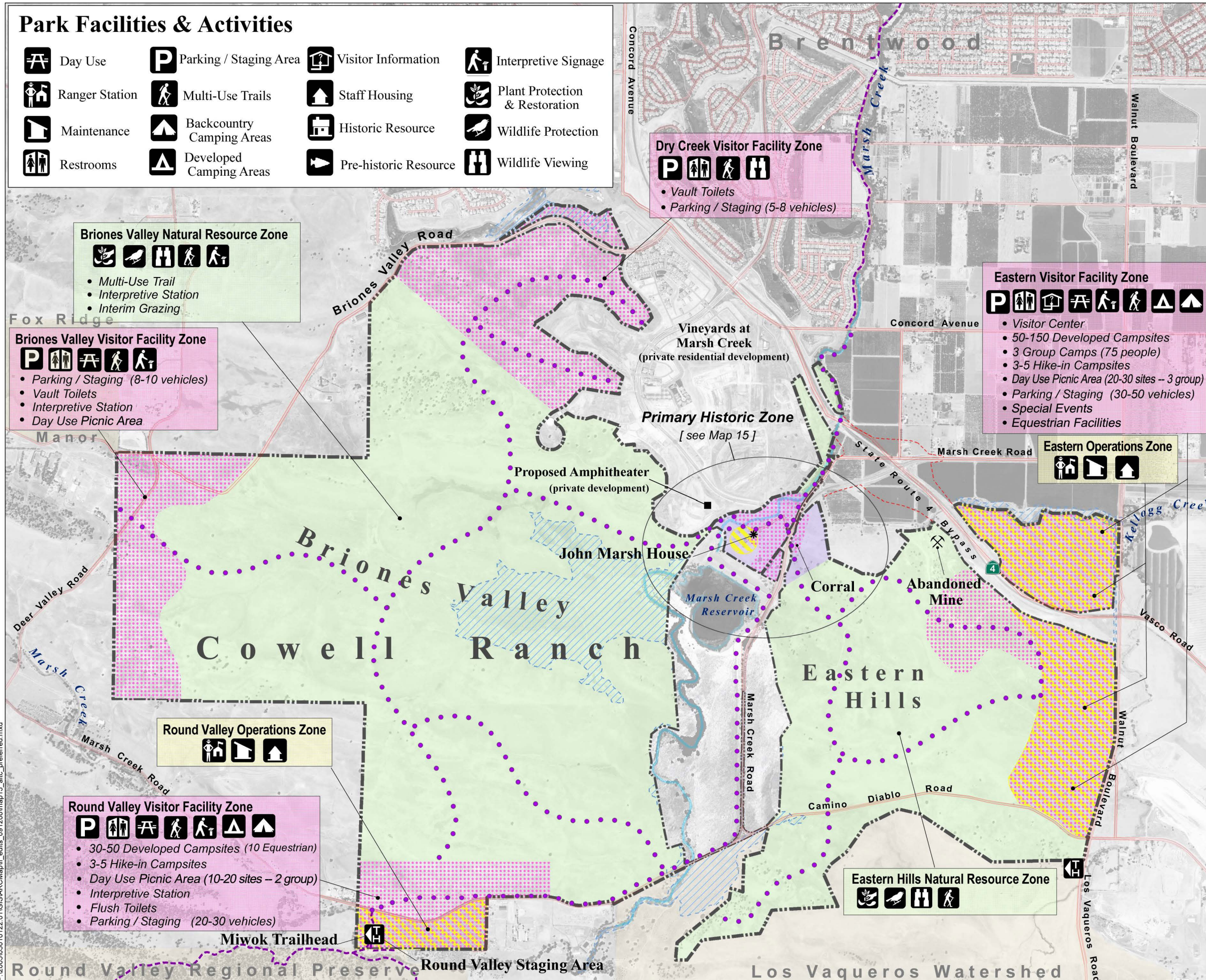

- Parking / Staging (5-8 vehicles)

Eastern Visitor Facility Zone

- Visitor Center
- 50-150 Developed Campsites
- 3 Group Camps (75 people)
- 3-5 Hike-in Campsites
- Day Use Picnic Area (20-30 sites -- 3 group)
- Parking / Staging (30-50 vehicles)
- Special Events
- Equestrian Facilities

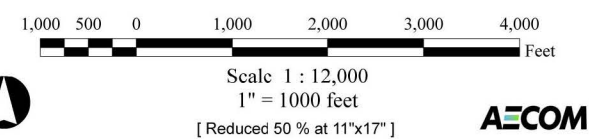
