SACRAMENTO, Calif. –California State Parks is accepting proposals for a ten-year camping and day use concession contract with the option to extend for an additional ten years at Brannan Island State Recreation Area (SRA). Proposals are being accepted starting November 1, 2021 through January 18, 2022, by 2 p.m.
