THE FACILITY

The Statewide Museum Collections Center is a state of the art, LEED Silver certified building designed to house the State's cultural heritage collections. The concrete construction of the former military warehouse provides a self-regulating passive environment that reduces energy consumption while extending the life of the objects.

THE COLLECTIONS

Archaeology

Archaeology pulls back the layers of time, allowing us to better understand the complexity of past human activity and experiences. The Center's archaeological collections help tell the stories of original inhabitants, exploration and the settlement of varied cultures from across the globe. In the Center's archaeology laboratory, State Archaeologists study specimens and data gathered from sites throughout the State Parks system.

History

California's built environment tells a richly diverse story of settlers from around the world. These resources connect us to a shared heritage of cultures colliding, merging and evolving. State Historians use the Center's architectural artifacts, photographs and documentary materials in their research on historic structures and landscapes which offer valuable evidence of the lives and customs of earlier generations of Californians.

Museums

The Center houses a vast collection of museum objects illustrating the story of California's rich heritage, assembled over the years. Though many of our most important historical artifacts are featured in our museums throughout the state, when collections are not on display, they are often transferred to the Center. The work of Curators, Archivists, and Collections Managers entails processing, preserving and documenting California's largest collection of artifacts, documentary materials, and photographs.
