May 4 - 6: RE-ENACTMENT MULE AND HORSE RIDE

Ride will follow the historic Overland Mail Route from Box Canyon to Cuyamaca Rancho State Park, concluding with a BBQ dinner, traditional Dutch Oven cooking, and interpretive talks on the Overland Mail and mules—the "Heroes of the West." Ride will cover an estimated 12 miles with an elevation gain of 2,000 feet. Ride includes overnight at Los Vaqueros Equestrian Camp with reservations. Public viewing opportunities at 5 pm Saturday at Pedro Fages Trail Historical Marker on Sunrise Highway approximately one mile south of intersection with SR79.

June 15, 16, and 17, 2007: RE-ENACTMENT OF OVERLAND MAIL THROUGH CUYAMACA RANCHO STATE PARK

Celebration includes three days of activities, including a two-night campout at Merigan Ranch in Descanso and an 11-mile horseback ride carrying the mail pouch from Cuyamaca Lake area through Cuyamaca Rancho State Park to Descanso. Music and entertainment includes local cowboy poet John Sedberry and local master storyteller Garry McClintock. Enjoy a night of dinner and dancing at Descanso Hay and Feed's barn and a Sunday morning breakfast.

Time: The event will begin at 2 pm. on Friday June 15, when campers will start arriving. Join us for a potluck dinner and music Friday night. The ride begins 10 am Saturday morning from Sunrise Day Use area. Dinner will be offered on Saturday night, followed by live band and dancing. Sunday morning, a catered breakfast will be available at 7:30 a.m.

Location: Ride begins at Sunrise Day Use area through Cuyamaca Rancho State Park and will end with camping at Merigan Ranch in Descanso, CA.

Fee: \$55 per person for 2-nights, 3 days camping. \$35 for dinner and dancing Saturday night only.

August 31 & September 1: CELEBRATING THE WEST ON THE MOVE: 150TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE OVERLAND MAIL

Telephone, email, text message – what was life like before instant communication? Can you imagine the thrill of the people in San Diego when the Overland Mail first arrived on August 31, 1857? Come join us on August 31 - September 1 when Old Town San Diego State Historic Park celebrates the 150th anniversary of the first delivery of mail to come overland from San Antonio, Texas. Old Town San Diego residents will kick off the two-day event with a Friday evening fundraiser that will feature a BBQ reminiscent of the days of the ranchos, with entertainment and a guided tour of the newly renovated exhibits in the Seeley Stable.

Saturday, September 1, 2007, begins at high noon with the historic re-enactment of the Overland Mail arriving in Old Town San Diego as part of a grand parade. Stay the day and enjoy activities that celebrate transportation and life in San Diego during the 1800s. You will be able to cheer on the trick ropers, be amazed by equestrian demonstrations, see historic wagons, and participate in games for the young and old that were popular 150 years ago.
