Regular day use hours for Old Sacramento State Historic Park, the exterior grounds of Sutter's Fort State Historic Park, the California State Indian Museum as bordered by "K" Street on the north, 26th Street on the west, "L" Street on the south, and 28th Street on the east, and the California Indian Heritage Center property located in West Sacramento parcel # 016535 are:

SUNRISE TO SUNSET seven days a week year round


Regular day use hours for Sutter's Fort State Historic Park buildings and interior grounds (2701 "L" Street, Sacramento CA), the California State Indian Museum interior facilities (2618 "K" Street Sacramento CA), and the exterior grounds and interior facilities of the Leland Stanford Mansion State Historic Park (800 "N" Street, Sacramento CA), and the interior facilities of the California State Railroad Museum (125 1 Street, Sacramento CA) are:

10:00 A.M. TO 5:00 P.M seven days a week year round except New Year's Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day

CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE PROHIBITION

In accordance with provisions of Section 4326 of Title 14, California Code of Regulations, for the protection of the health and safety of persons, property, and resources in California State Parks Capital District the consumption of alcoholic beverages is hereby prohibited beginning July 1, 2019. This policy is effective in all day use areas and closed areas of the Capital District to include: Old Sacramento State Historic Park including the Sacramento River Parkway, the Riverfront Beach Area, the California State Railroad Museum, Leland Stanford Mansion State Historic Park, Sutter's Fort State Historic Park, the California State Indian Museum and the California Indian Heritage Center property located in West Sacramento parcel # 016535.


"Alcoholic beverage" means any alcohol, spirits, wine, beer and every liquid or solid containing alcohol, spirits, wine, or beer.

"Consumption" means the act of consuming, and "consume" is defined as "to eat or drink up."

GLASS CONTAINER PROHIBITION

In accordance with provisions of Section 4326 of Title 14, California Code of Regulations, for the protection of the health and safety of the visiting public, due to the serious hazard created by discarded and/or broken glass, possession of glass containers is hereby prohibited in Riverfront Park and the American / American River Parkway in Old Sacramento and the California Indian Heritage Center property located in West Sacramento parcel # 016535 beginning July 1, 2019. Prohibited areas include:

-Riverfront Beach bordered by Latitude 38.584949 to the north, the Sacramento River to the west, Latitude 38.584128 to the south, and the Retaining Wall on the west side of the Sacramento River Multi- use recreation trail to the east.

-Northern closed area bordered by "I" Street Bridge to north, the Sacramento River to the west, the Retaining Wall along the Sacramento River Multi- use Recreation Trail to the east, and Latitude 38.5844949 to the south.

-Southern closed area bordered by Latitude 38.584128 to the north, Sacramento River to the west, the Retaining Wall located along Longitude- 121.505953 to the east and the "J" Street Dock to the south.


- Parcel # 016535, West Sacramento, California Indian Heritage Center Property.

The prohibition includes any glass bottle, tumbler, or vessel of any nature, empty or not, except that persons may pick up glass containers left or discarded by others and remove or deposit same in an approved trash or recycling receptacle.

SMOKING PROHIBITION

In accordance with provisions of Section 4326 of Title 14, California Code of Regulations, for the protection of the health and safety of persons, property, and resources, smoking is prohibited in the Riverfront Beach Park area of Old Sacramento State Historic Park, the grounds of Sutter's Fort State Historic Park, the California State Indian Museum and the California Indian Heritage Center property located in West Sacramento parcel # 016535.

Riverfront Beach is defined as bordered by the "I" Street Bridge to the north, the Sacramento River to the west, the retaining wall on the west side of the Sacramento River Multi-use Recreation Trail to the east, and the "J" Street Dock to the south.

The grounds of Sutter's Fort State Historic Park and the State Indian Museum are bordered by "K" Street on the North, 26th Street on the west, "L" Street on the south, and 28th Street on the East.


An exception to this order consists of the decomposed granite sidewalks adjacent to "K" Street, 26th Street, "L" Street, and 28th Street only.

CLOSED/PROHIBITED AREA

In accordance with the provisions of Section 4326 of Title 14, California Code of Regulations, for the Protection of the health and safety of persons, property and resources parts of Riverfront Park, the Sacramento/American River Parkway and parcel numbers 00900120580000, 00900120480000 as well as all of 00900120590000 in Old Sacramento State Historic Park are hereby closed to the public beginning July 1, 2019. Closed Areas are defined as:

Riverfront Park

- Northern closed area bordered by the "I" Street Bridge to the North, Sacramento River to the west, Retaining wall on the west side of the Sacramento River Multi-Use Recreation Trail to the east and Latitude 38.584949 to the south.
- Southern closed area bordered by Latitude 38.584128 to the north, Sacramento River to the west, Retaining wall located along the Longitude -121.505953 to the east and "J" Street Dock to the south.


Parcels near 1931 Front Street

- The east side of the closed area runs along Front Street from latitude 38.573175, longitude -121.510025 to latitude 38.573701, longitude -121.509805.
- The north side of the closed area runs from Front Street at latitude 38.573701, longitude -121.509805 to the Sacramento River Bike Trail at latitude 38.573993, longitude -121.510902.
- The west side of the closed area runs along the Sacramento River Bike Trail from latitude 38.573993, longitude -121.510902 to latitude 38.573532, longitude -121.511368.
- The south side of the closed area follows the fence line from latitude 38.573175, longitude -121.510025 to the railroad tracks and extends to latitude 38.573532, longitude -121.511368 west of the tracks.

Storage of Personal Property Prohibited

In accordance with provisions of Section 4326 of title 14, California Code of Regulations, for the protection of the health and safety of persons, property, and resources within the lands and facilities of Capital District State Park Units it is unlawful and a public nuisance for any person to store, or leave unattended, any personal property including camp paraphernalia, carts, or luggage.

"Store" means to put aside or accumulate for use when needed, to put for safekeeping, to place or leave in any location unattended.


Per California Civil Code § 2080.1 and S 2080.7 respectively, personal property stored on or in Capital District lands or facilities will be immediately removed and stored by State Park Peace Officers as found or abandoned property. If unclaimed after ninety days the property will be disposed of per those sections.

Persons observed by State Park Peace Officers violating this order will be subject to citation or arrest.

CAMPING PROHIBITED

In accordance with provisions of Section 4326 of title 14, California Code of Regulations, for the protection of the health and safety of persons, property, and resources within the lands and facilities of Capital District State Park Units it is unlawful and a public nuisance for any person to camp on the grounds of any Capital District unit.

Definitions: Per California Code of Regulation Title 14 4301 (u) camping is defined as "Erecting a tent, shelter, or arranging bedding or both for the purposes of, or in such a way as will permit, remaining overnight." Per CCR T14 4451 (a) No person shall camp, as defined in Section 4301 (u), in any unit except in area provided for that purpose.

Capital District Camping Prohibitions CCRT14
4326(a) 670-18-008:

- (a) No unit within the Capital District is available for camping at any time.
- (b) No person shall erect a tent or shelter in any Capital District unit without the consent of the District Superintendent or designee
- (c) Shade structures shall be open on all sides with clear visibility through the structure from all points of view
- (d) No person shall place a mattress, foam pad, bed, camp bed, hammock or any sleeping structure on Capital District grounds

BICYCLE USE AND PARKING

In accordance with provisions of Section 4326 of Title 14, California Code of Regulations, for the protection of the health and safety of persons, property, and resources within the lands and facilities of Capital District State Park Units regulations for the use and parking are hereby established July 1, 2019:


Capital District Bicycle Regulations:

- (a) No person shall take a bicycle into a Capital District lavatory
- (b) No person shall park a bicycle or bicycle trailer on any walkway or boardwalk, as to adversely affect safe passage.
- (c) Bicycles improperly parked may be removed and stored by Capital District State Park Peace Officers by cutting and removing a locking device when necessary per CCC § 2080.1 and 2080.7 respectively
- (d) Bicycles parked on disability access ramps will be removed and stored as above by Capital District State Park Peace Officers
- (e) No person shall ride a bicycle on a boardwalk. All bicycles will be dismounted and walked through these areas; pedestrians have the right of way on boardwalks.
- (f) Per CCR T 14 4326(a) 670-16-010 the parking lot of the California State Railroad Museum at 125 1 Street in Old Sacramento State historic Park is closed to all persons except authorized personnel. No person shall ride a bicycle through said parking lot.

Exceptions to this order may be granted in writing by the District Superintendent or designee, Capital District, 101 J Street, Sacramento, CA 95814.

CSRM Railway Turntable east entry

-Closed area is anything inside the black iron fence surrounding the Railway Turntable

Sacramento Southern Railroad (SSRR)


-Any railroad tracks or right of way that starts in Old Sacramento and runs south to the gate across the tracks located 335 feet south of the RR crossing at South Land Park Drive

-Any railroad tracks running south from the RR crossing at the south side of Meadowview/ Pocket Road and continuing to the north edge of the roadway at Hood/Franklin Road in Hood, CA that is not at an authorized vehicle or pedestrian crossing

SCAVENGING PROHIBITED



Use of State Electrical Utilities


In accordance with provisions of Section 4326 of Title 14, California Code of Regulations, for the protection of the health and safety of persons, property and resources the electric utilities/electrical outlets located on and in the Capital District State Park units are to be utilized for State Park business only unless authorized for use other than business related. This policy is effective in all Capital District Buildings and their surrounding grounds including but not limited to; the California State Railroad Museum, Leland Stanford Mansion State Historic Park, Sutter's Fort State Historic Park, the California State Indian Museum and the California Indian Heritage Center Property located in West Sacramento parcel #016535.

No persons without authorization shall be utilizing the electrical utilities/outlets to power any device or equipment. Any accessible outlets are in place for the sole use of State Parks staff during their course of employment. Persons observed by State Parks Peace Officers utilizing the electrical utilities/outlets in violation of this order will be subject to citation or arrest.

Exceptions to this order may be granted in writing by the District Superintendent or designee, Capital District, 101 "J" Street, Sacramento, CA 95814.
