

SAVE-THE-DATE GRANT ANNOUNCEMENT

California State Parks Division of Boating and Waterways (DBW)

QZ Grant Program

has the following 2024 announcement:

The application period for the 2024 cycle will open on **April 1, 2024** and will close on **May 10, 2024** at 5:00 p.m.

Up to **\$2M** is expected to be awarded.

A presentation will be conducted via MS Teams on **April 4, 2024**; information will be posted on our webpage at: QZGrant@parks.ca.gov

The 2024 two-year QZ grants are expected to begin in September.

Minimum Eligibility Requirements:

- 1. Grant applicant must own/manage any aspect of the water in a reservoir;
- 2. The reservoir must be open to the public for recreation; and
- 3. Grant applicant must demonstrate that the reservoir is uninfested with dreissenid mussels.
- 4. NEW: Due to limited funding from low mussel fee sticker sales, applicants can no longer apply for overlapping grant cycles for the same reservoir; they will need to reapply every other year. This means that if a reservoir is currently covered by a two-year 2023 QZ Grant, that reservoir will not be considered for a QZ Grant until the 2025 solicitation.

To demonstrate that the reservoir is uninfested, applicants must provide mussel monitoring data collected since March 2023. Monitoring data can be from surface surveys, artificial substrates, and plankton tows.

Tier 2 Implementation Grant:

 To be eligible for an implementation grant, applicants must provide a letter from the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) at the time of application that states CDFW has reviewed and accepted a prevention plan for the reservoir (per Fish and Game Code Section 2302 and California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Section 672.1(b)).

Tier 1 Planning and Assessment Grant:

 Applicants that do not already have a CDFW-accepted prevention plan can apply for a planning and assessment grant in order to develop a CDFW-accepted prevention plan for the reservoir.
