Boating Infrastructure Grant Program Loan and Grant Financial Services Division of Boating and Waterways August 12, 2021

Summary: The Boating Infrastructure Grant (BIG) program funds construction or improvement of visitor facilities for recreational transient vessels 26-feet or longer on any waterbody serving these vessels. Improvements may include visitor docks, utilities, mooring buoys, navigational aids, gangways, marine fueling stations, dredging, and restrooms. The Division of Boating and Waterways (DBW) is the state entity designated for implementing the federal BIG program in California and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) is the administering federal agency. DBW acts as a pass-through entity for the application process and is responsible for ensuring federal requirements and project accountability are met once a project is approved and funded by the USFWS.

Application Deadline: August 2, 2021, for federal fiscal year 2021/22 funding.

Application Procedure: Applicants are required to submit applications to DBW by the deadline. DBW then packages and submits the most competitive applications to the USFWS for consideration of federal funding. Tier I applications are for projects \$200,000 or less. Tier II applications are for projects exceeding \$200,000 but not more than \$1.5 million per applicant; the most competitive applications are forwarded to the USFWS, which scores and ranks the applications by a national review committee.

Program Accomplishments: USFWS selected one Tier I application for funding from the FFY2020/21 grant cycle. City of Redondo Beach was awarded \$200,000 for the removal of two dilapidated pumpout docks and construction of one larger pumpout dock that will accommodate two pumpout stations. Two BIG funded projects were completed this year; they are the San Pedro Public Market Courtesy Dock and the West Sacramento Raley's Landing Etenesh Zeleke Public Dock.

Typical Grant Amount: Varies.

Funding Source(s): U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Sport Fish Restoration and Boating Trust Fund.

Eligible Grant Recipients: Publicly and privately owned facilities that are open to the public.

Restrictions:

- a. All facilities constructed with BIG funding must be open and available to the public.
- b. Grant funding is only for facility improvements benefiting recreational, transient vessels 26 feet or longer. When proposed improvements benefit other boater groups or uses, project costs must be prorated accordingly and supplemental funding identified in the application.
- c. Grantees are required to operate and maintain the BIG facilities for the useful life of the improvement.
- d. A 25 percent minimum local match is required.
- e. Projects must comply with federal National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) requirements.
- f. Private businesses or concessionaires are prohibited from doing business from BIG-funded facilities.
