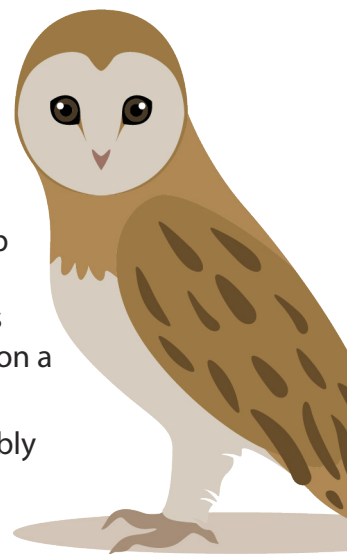

## Day Trip Option

Colonel Allensworth State Historic Park offers cellphone tours, which give a brief history of the town's residences and buildings at each stop. A key stop is at the schoolhouse, which remained in use until 1972 and is furnished as it would have been on a school day in 1915.
