

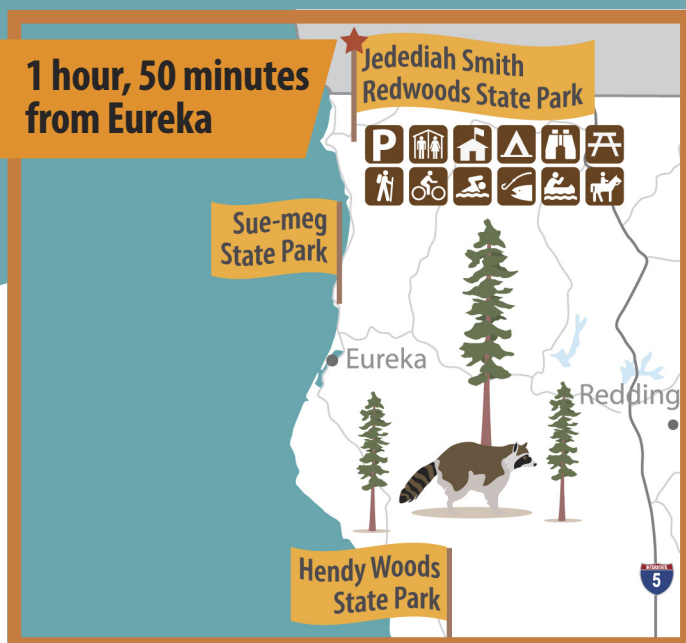


# JEDEDIAH SMITH REDWOODS STATE PARK

Jedediah Smith Redwoods State Park is the last in a long string of redwood parks that stretch up Northern California's coast. A few miles inland from the ocean, the park is densely forested with huge ancient trees. The Smith River—the longest major free-flowing river in California—offers the opportunity to fish, snorkel, or kayak.

## Day Trip Option

The state park hosts 20 miles of trails through a lush rainforest. Destinations include the stately Stout Memorial Grove and the heart of the Jedediah Smith Redwoods State Park, the Grove of Titans. Trees featured within the state park include coast redwoods, big-leaf maple, western hemlock, and California hazel.
