

Day Trip Option

The state park offers 11 hiking trails, ranging from 1.3 miles to 3.9 miles. The Pioneer Tree Trail, a 2.1-mile loop trail, is one of the most popular trails and features beautiful wildflowers along a family-friendly hike through the redwoods.
