Area Closed, McArthur Burney Falls Memorial State Park

Beginning April 1, 2024, trail closures will remain in place for the duration of the 2024 summer season and most likely the fall season. The closure is to address critical repairs and improvements to the trails and natural slopes that have been impacted by high visitation and substantial use of these sensitive areas for foot access to the pool. Visitors will have no access to the waterfall and fall's pool area with limited access/viewing at the top of the falls.

The following lands at McArthur-Burney Falls Memorial State Park are closed to public use, entry or occupancy:

- a. Falls Loop Trail
- b. Burney Creek Trail

EXCEPTIONS TO CLOSURE:

- 1. The remainder of the park will be open to visitors including the Rim and Pioneer campgrounds, Burney General Store, Marina, Visitor Center, and Day use areas.
- 2. The Rim Trail, PSEA Trail, Headwaters Trail and Pioneer Cemetery Trail will remain open.
- 3. The Fisherman's Bridge will remain open to provide access to and from the park via the Pacific Crest Trail, Headwaters Trail Loop, and Headwaters Equestrian Camp only from the Falls Overlook.

Exceptions to this order may only be granted in writing by the District Superintendent, Northern Buttes, District, 400 Glen Drive, Oroville, CA 95966. Nothing herein contained shall be construed in derogation of other provisions of law.
