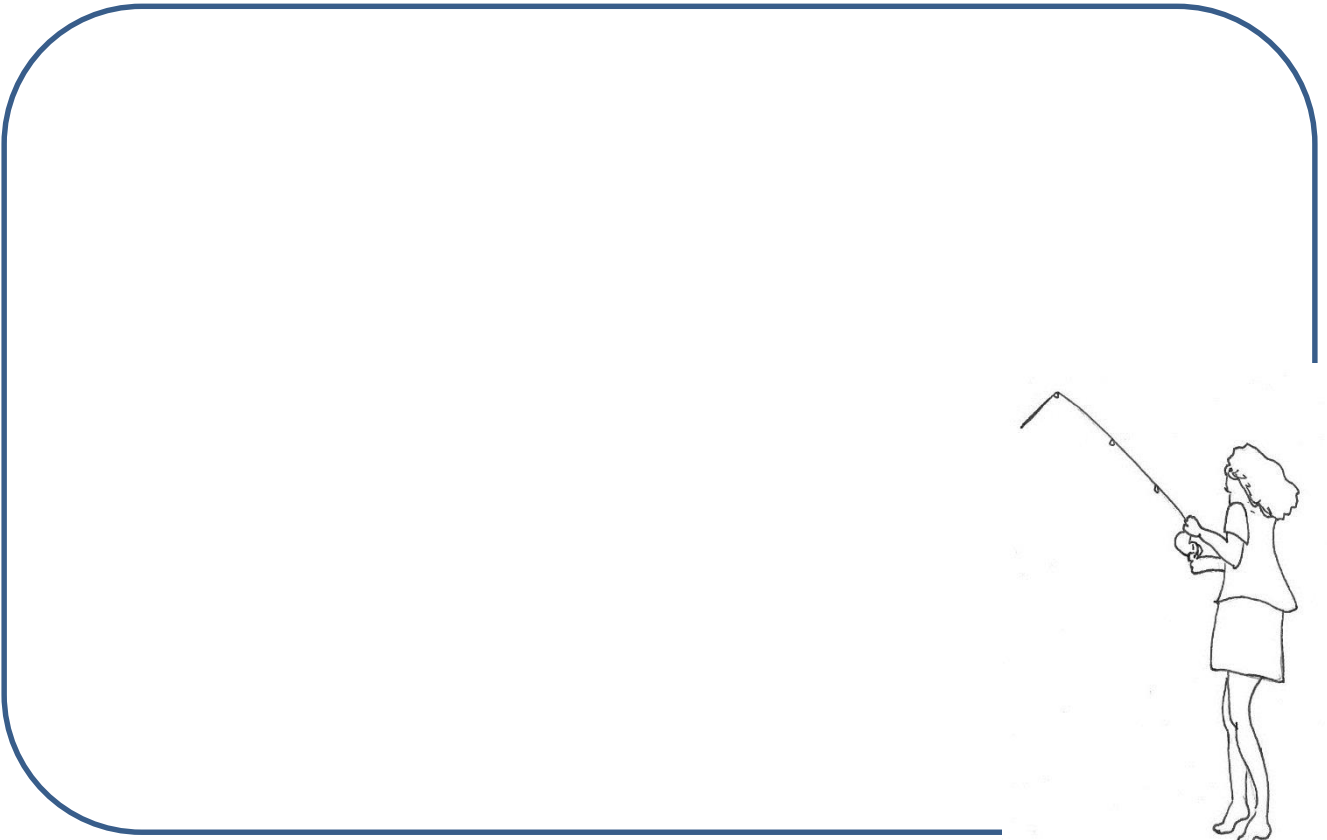

Many parks have campgrounds to camp under the stars, where you can enjoy the night sky. Go camping with family and friends to have an overnight adventure.

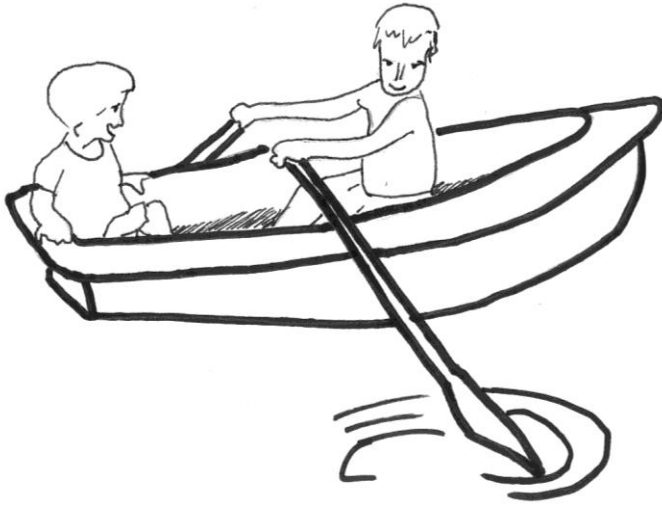


Ride a Bike

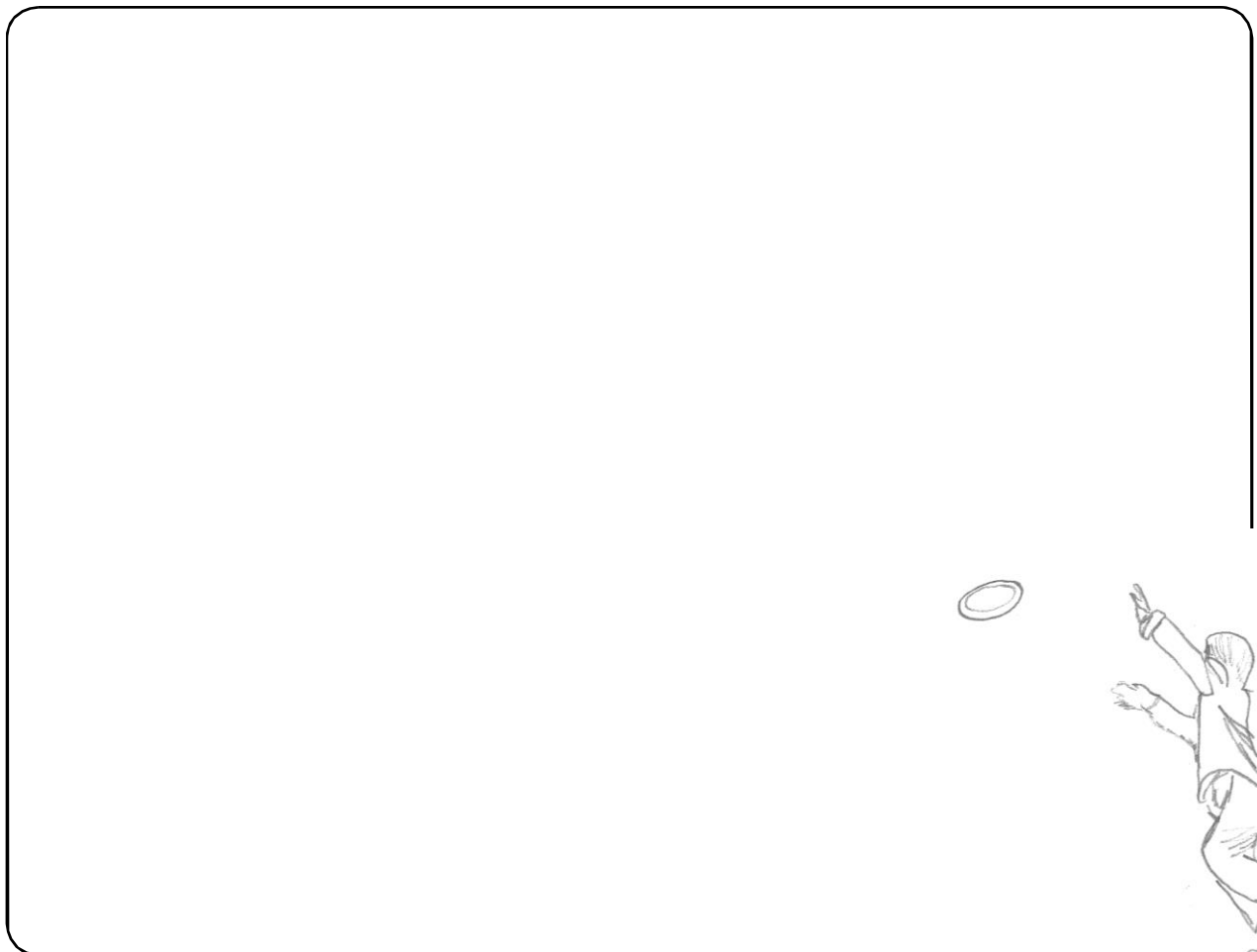
