PROJECT TITLE: Vikingsholm Turret Repairs

LOCATION: Emerald Bay State Park **COUNTY:** El Dorado

DESCRIPTION OF THE NATURE AND PURPOSE OF PROJECT: The project proposes to stabilize the turret on the Vikingsholm structure at Emerald Bay State Park to allow for continued use of the turret for interpretive purposes as well as to provide for the safety of park visitors and staff. Prior to starting work on or around the turret, the contractor will construct a temporary entrance for access to the project site. Work will:

- Install a pump and weir tank for site dewatering if needed;
- Excavate to install a French drain system draining to an infiltration well;
- Inside the base of the turret, use hand tools to excavate a 3-ft deep x 18-in. wide x 60-ft long trench at one location. Remove the spoils and haul offsite;
- Install reinforcing steel for a concrete grade beam and pour concrete and allow to cure;
- Install two (2) 6-in. wide x 25-ft long steel beams, supported by wood cribbing;
- Around the exterior perimeter of the turret, excavate approx. 60 linear ft of a 3-ft deep x 18-in. wide trench and stockpile spoil onsite for reuse;
- Pour a concrete slurry, allow to set, and install grout in gap between slurry and grade beam;
- Reinstall stockpiled soil over cured slurry, backfilling to grade;
- Patch and repair cracks on exterior of turret; and
- Repair and repoint two (2) existing chimneys and replace flashing as needed.
